SEVIS Name Standards



Name Standards

- Latin (Roman) alphabet characters only with no diacritical marks (except in Preferred Name)
- No hyphens (except in Preferred Name)
- No apostrophes (except in Preferred Name)
- One space between names
- Single comma preceding the suffix in Preferred Name

SEVIS will impose a universal standard of naming conventions, so names are entered consistently.



Name Standards

- Not allowed
 - LNU
 - FNU
 - Unknown
 - Not Applicable
 - None
- Confirmation of name required
 - Unk (case insensitive)
 - Na (case insensitive)



SEVIS Name Fields – Revised

- ★ Surname/Primary Name
- Given Name
- Suffix
- Passport Name
- Preferred Name

★ = Required Field

Note: Name fields revised from previously released information.



New Name	Prior Field Name	Characteristics
Surname/Primary Name	Family Name	Required 40 characters
Given Name	First and Middle Names combined	Optional 80 characters
Suffix	Same drop-down list	Optional
Passport Name	New	Optional, Editable 39 characters
Preferred Name	New	Optional, Editable If user does not add, the field is populated with Surname/ Primary Name, Given Name Any suffix will be concatenated with a comma preceding it 145 characters



Compatibility with Other Systems

- SEVIS will conform to international standards for passport machine readable zone
- Standards described in Document 9303 – Machine Readable Travel Documents, Sixth Edition 2006; International Civil Aviation Organization
 - Used globally
 - ISO endorsed

Visual Inspection Zone

- Names can include national-specific characters
- If name uses an alphabet different from the Latin (Roman) alphabet, must provide a transliteration of the name



Machine Readable Zone

- Issuing country determines transliteration of names into MRZ standard
- Passport-issuing country determines:
 - Primary identifier
 - Secondary identifier (name components not included in primary identifier)

Implementation Timeline



Phasing-in SEVIS Name Standards

- July 2014: Name Report available
- November 2014: Batch testing begins
- Spring 2015: Standards become mandatory; names in SEVIS brought up to standards
- Now: School/sponsor official may voluntarily begin using new standards

Institutions may opt to have SEVP handle all the transition of data for them.



Submitted Questions

Q The machine readable sections of the passport for ALL students from Malaysia (and I believe Singapore as well) seem to have the format MYSJack<Binti<John<Doe (and the passport page has no first or last name distinction), but I've never met a Malaysian student say their name is all four parts. I don't think our Malaysian students would be thrilled to suddenly have 4 last names and no first name.



Submitted Questions

Q How should RO/AROs list the family name on the Form DS-2019, when the biographical section of the passport has the special character (Müller), BUT the machine readable portion has the phonetic spelling (Mueller); and which name is used for the Form I-94, SSA, DMV, etc. – i.e., will it be the family/primary name or the passport name (from the chart, “Proposed SEVIS Name Conventions)?



Submitted Questions

Q What should DSOs do when students, particularly from India, have no surname on the passport and two names in the Given Name category. In these cases, even the MRZ does not include anything for the surname. We place all of the given names in the last name category. When the visa is issued, the student will usually have FNU or LNU for first or last name. The inconsistency in the records creates problems with driver's licenses, SSN, or employer background checks (while on OPT).



Submitted Questions

Q Considering all the work involved and problems to resolve yet, I do not see how this project is going to improve the use of SEVIS. Am I missing something from the webinar, as to the necessity of imposing these standards?



Submitted Questions

Q If the Middle Name field is removed from SEVIS, then the Form I-20 should also be updated to eliminate the Middle Name field; otherwise, there is the possibility that a student's full given name will not be properly shown on the Form I-20. This will cause distress to the students and increase inquiries to schools, colleges, and universities; if not the SEVIS Help Desk, as well.



Submitted Questions

Q Malaysian names are ordered: Given, Primary/Family, Middle (usually 2, if Chinese). The MRZ also follows this order with no double-character filler separating the names. The U.S. consulate correctly identifies the primary/family and given names in the visa. In this case, it seems appropriate to follow that country's convention instead of listing all 4-5 names as "primary," simply because there is no "double-character filler" separating the names, does it not?



Names – Frequently Asked Questions

- Q** What should we do if we don't have the passport to refer to when creating the Form I-20?
- Q** How will PDSOs, DSOs, ROs, and AROs be notified, if SEVIS changes a nonimmigrant's name?
- Q** Will school/sponsor officials get a list of nonimmigrant names in advance, which will be changed?
