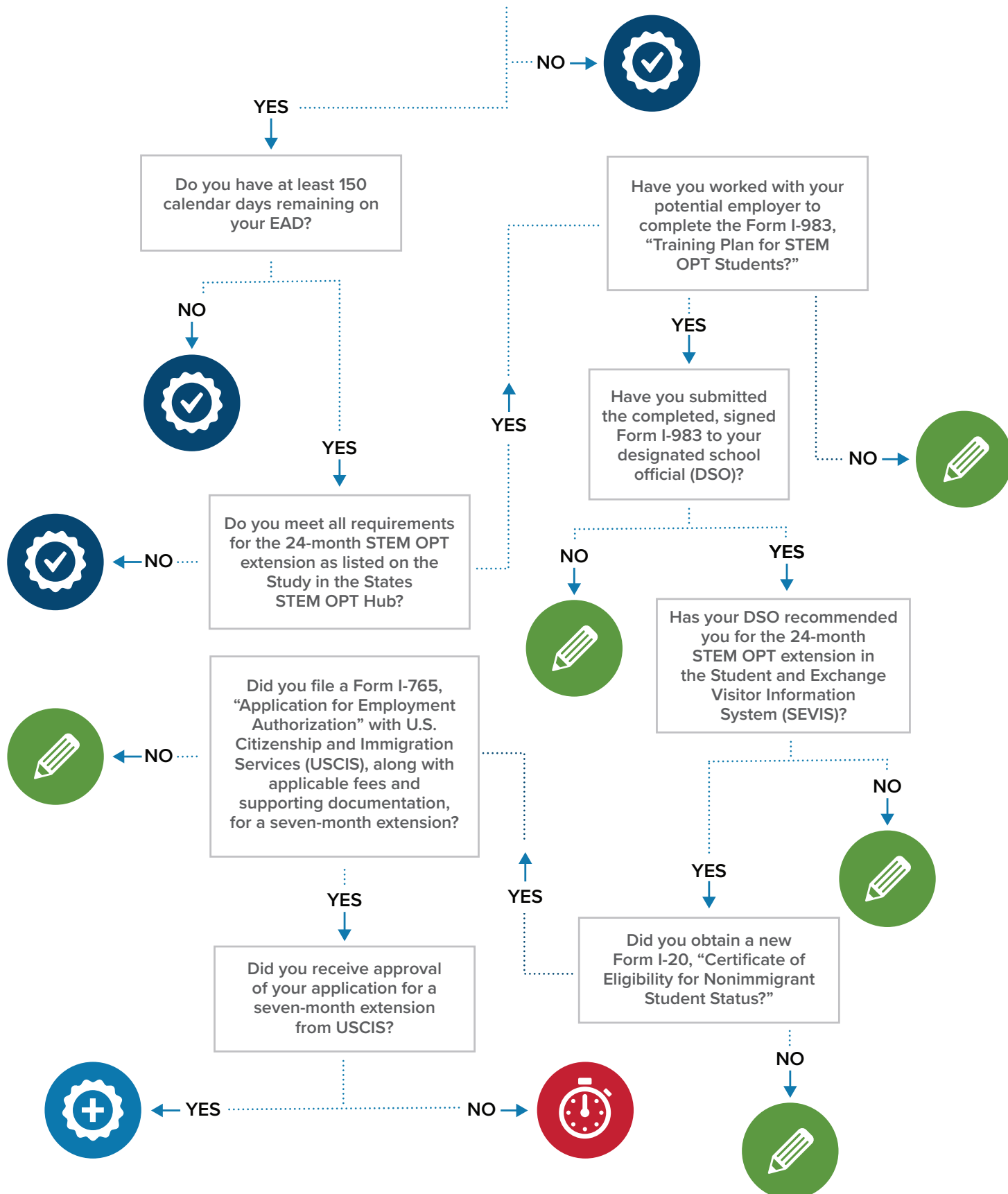


# STUDENTS WITH EXISTING 17-MONTH STEM OPT EADS

On May 10, 2016 the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's 24-month optional practical training (OPT) extension for students with science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) degrees effectively replaced the 17-month STEM OPT extension.

Certain students with an existing 17-month STEM OPT employment authorization document (EAD) will have until August 8, 2016 to apply for an additional seven months of OPT. If you have an existing 17-month STEM OPT EAD, take this quiz to help determine if you qualify for the seven-month extension and what next steps you should take.

### CONTINUE TO FOLLOW THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF YOUR EXISTING 17-MONTH EAD

Any 17-month STEM OPT EAD that USCIS issued on or before May 9, 2016, will remain valid until the EAD expires, is terminated or revoked. You may be ineligible for the additional seven months or select not to apply. ### CHECK USCIS' PROCESSING TIMES

If you submitted your application and required documents but do not know whether your application was approved or denied, visit [USCIS' website](#) for more information. If you receive a denial from USCIS, you are ineligible or otherwise unauthorized to participate in an additional seven months of STEM OPT, and must depart the United States unless authorized for another status or beginning a new program of study within 60 days of your OPT end date.



### FOLLOW THE TERMS OF YOUR NEW EAD FOR THE SEVEN-MONTH EXTENSION AFTER YOUR CURRENT EAD EXPIRES

USCIS will issue an EAD with a new validity period. Follow these new terms and conditions once your current EAD has expired.



### SUBMIT ALL INFORMATION AND DOCUMENTS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE BEFORE THE AUGUST 8, 2016 DEADLINE
