## Check it Out! Read the August 2015 SEVIS by the Numbers Report

Are you interested in international student data? If so, we encourage you to check out the latest [SEVIS by the Numbers report](#), which highlights international student data and trends of the more than one million F and M international students in the United States.

This report uses data from the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) to provide a trends and insights on the number of F, M and J students in the United States, top places of origin, student demographics, the schools that enroll the most students and more. The August 2015 SEVIS by the Numbers report focuses on international students studying at schools in California, New York and Texas.

## SEVP Deploys Third Class of Field Representatives

SEVP recently deployed the third class of field representatives to 15 territories across the United States. To date, SEVP has deployed 42 of the planned 60 field representatives nationwide. The third class of field representatives will join those that have been operating in the field since 2014 and provide support to designated school officials at SEVP-certified schools.

SEVP is in the process of hiring the remaining field representatives. We have selected the fourth and final class of field representatives, and plan to train and deploy the class before the end of December 2015.
